Built in an industrial style, the decor included some quirky film set themes that made the hotel very popular with film and production houses. 2011 saw a complete refurbishment of the Hotel, reclaiming its reputation as a trendsetter!

Day 4: On the Cliff, Hermanus

Hermanus

Built along the beautiful shores and cliffs of Walker Bay, Hermanus has grown from a small seaside resort town to become possibly the best-known place for whale watching in the world. Today, this busy town is more than just a popular holiday destination and offers visitors all kinds of activities, both energetic and relaxing.

Day Notes

A beautiful scenic coastal drive brings you to Hermanus - one of the best land-based whale watching destinations in the world during the months July to October. You need not even go out to sea by boat, the whales come right up to the cliffs where concrete paths help you to get as close to them as possible.

Overnight: On the Cliff

On the Cliffs is an inviting, highly hospitable guest house situated in the picturesque town of Hermanus. This narrow coastal town is the best land based whale watching destination in the world and an icon of the Western Cape. Within easy reach of Cape Town, convenience and comfort is at the order of the day.



Alternate: Hermanus Beach Villa

Alternate: Elephant Hide Guest House

Situated on top of the Welbedacht Cliff Tops 3km from Knysna Town, the Lodge overlooks the Knysna Lagoon and the Outeniqua mountains. The theme of the Lodge is one based on natural beauty with stone and wood architecture combining to give that comfortable earth feel. Four of the suites have magical views onto the Knysna lagoon from every corner of the room.

Garden Route

Day Notes

Drive eastwards to the Stormsriver Mouth in the Tsitsikamma National Park, staying in national park chalets. This is not a game park, but a nature park with unsurpassed natural beauty, poised between a craggy shoreline of black

rocks pounded by foamy white surf and steep forested cliffs. The Treetop Canopy Tour is a must! This is where your circular tour turns around.

Overnight: Storms River Mouth Rest Camp

Where the booming breakers of the Indian Ocean pound rocky shores, where temperate high forest and fynbos roll down to the sea in an unspoilt verdant carpet, where ancient rivers carve their paths to the ocean down rocky ravines. This is the Tsitsikamma Section of the Garden Route National Park.







Alternate: Tsitsikamma Village Inn

Tsitsikamma Village Inn, located in the village of Storms River on the beautiful Garden Route, offers a unique form of accommodation. Most of our rooms are situated around a typical Village green. These buildings represent many of the different building styles that were to be found in the Cape Colony during the 1800s.







Day 9: The Views Boutique Hotel & Spa, Wilderness

Day Notes

Skimming past the now familiar towns of Plettenberg Bay and Knysna on your return trip, you now stop off at Wilderness where you can enjoy the beach, some forest walks or canoe along the river.

Overnight: The Views Boutique Hotel & Spa

With the warm Indian Ocean waters playing at its feet, VIEWS Boutique Hotel & Spa is an idyllic paradise from which to unlock the secrets of South Africa's famed Garden Route. Perfectly situated, on a beach front dune on Wilderness Beach, offering panoramic beach and ocean views, a mere 20 minutes from George Airport.







Alternate: Wilderness Manor Guest House

Overlooking the beautiful Wilderness Lagoon, is the elegant and refined Wilderness Manor Guest House. Wilderness Manor is situated in Waterside Road and is within easy and safe walking distance to golden beaches, restaurants and village shops.

Day 10: De Oue Werf Country House, Route 62

Route 62

Route 62 might market itself as the longest Wine Route in the world, but that's definitely not all there is to it. Lush greenery and fertile valleys form a stark contrast against the semi-desert of the Klein Karoo while towering mountains and their rivers and streams provide an awe-inspiring backdrop throughout. Some of the renowned attractions visitors will spot as they follow the route are the winelands of the Breede River Valley, the majestic Swartberg mountains, the Cango Caves and ostrich farms of Oudtshoorn, and the fruit orchards of the Langkloof Valley.

Day Notes

You have only a short drive to Oudtshoorn over the beautiful Outeniqua Pass, where you have enough time to visit the magnificent Cango Caves, an ostrich show farm and perhaps the Cango Wildlife Ranch

Overnight: De Oue Werf Country House

Oue Werf Guesthouse is a peaceful homestead nestled in the charming Schoemanshoek valley near Oudtshoorn. Situated in a radius of 15km from all tourist attractions.



Alternate: Rosenhof Country House <u>View iBrochure</u>

Rosenhof Country House is situated on the outskirts of Oudtshoorn en route to the Cango Caves and Ostrich farms. The carefully renovated homestead (circa 1852), with its yellowwood beams and ceilings and antique furniture, exudes an aura of authenticity.

Excellent Accommodation with a beautiful view in the heart of the Klein Karoo.

Day 11: Stellenbosch Hotel, Stellenbosch

Stellenbosch

A blend of historical architecture, student life, epicurean delights and oak-lined avenues, Stellenbosch is a picturesque university town surrounded by mountains and vineyards. A walking tour of the town centre allows visitors to take in its beautifully preserved Cape Dutch and Victorian architecture, as well as the many enticing art galleries, craft shops, clothing boutiques and gift stores, while foodies may prefer indulging in mouth-watering cuisine and fine wines at one of the chic restaurants or buzzing bistros. Stellenbosch is also the ideal base from which to explore the renowned local wine route, boasting a high proportion of the country's leading wine estates.

Day Notes

Instead of driving back to Cape Town on the N2 highway, we suggest you use the scenic Route 62, savouring the Little Karoo which has a beauty of its own. Gradually you move into mountain country and eventually arrive in the Winelands where you will overnight in Stellenbosch. Enjoy wine tasting and/or meals at some of the wine estates.

Overnight: Stellenbosch Hotel

The Stellenbosch Hotel is a 27 room boutique style hotel that also offers 6 self-catering studio and two-bedroom apartments. The hotel was built on land granted by Gov. Simon van der Stel between 1692 and 1701. The building was restored in 1987 and has been declared a national monument.



Alternate: L'Avenir Country Lodge

Surrounded by well-tended vineyards and breathtaking views of the majestic mountains of Stellenbosch, this newly renovated lodge offers the best of South africa wine tasting and a 4 star luxury accommodation in South Africa, award winning wines & true hospitality on a working wine farm.
