# ADELAIDE



#### Day 1: Arrival at Adelaide

Adelaide is South Australia's cosmopolitan coastal capital. Its ring of parkland on the River Torrens is home to renowned museums such as the Art Gallery of South Australia, displaying expansive collections including noted Indigenous art, and the South Australian Museum, devoted to natural history.

#### Day 2: Adelaide/Kangaroo Island

## AYERS ROCK (ULURU)



Welcome to Ayers Rock (Uluru) - one of the most impressive landmarks in Australia. A huge chunk of sandstone and a 'true' monolith, it resides in Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. Uluru is located down towards the southwest corner of the Northern Territory and close to the geographic centre of Australia...Welcome to the heart of Australia.

- **Non-private arrival transfer** using the courtesy shuttle bus of the resort (English-speaking driver).
- Check in at <u>Hotel</u> (1 night)

In the afternoon <u>Uluru Sunset Tour</u> (Small group touring with audio commentary in different languages): Departing the resort, the tour will

travel through the landscapes to the entrance of the Uluru Kata Tjuta National Park. From this point, it is only a matter of minutes before the spectra of Uluru rises from the sand dunes to demonstrate its enormity and presence in this country. Your guide will then return you to your accommodation at Ayers Rock Resort. We make our way to the western side of Kata Tjuta where you will have the opportunity to relax and enjoy an outback picnic breakfast. As you approach the entrance to Walpa Gorge (named for the wind, Walpa, that whistles between the massive domes that shape Kata Tjuta, the result of eons of weathering and continual upheaval) your guide will share the significance of this men's sacred ceremonial site. We take a stroll between these mighty conglomerate rock walls as your guide explains how the environment and the geology has evolved over millions of years. <u>Inclusions</u>: 5 hour fully guided tour, Sunrise at Kata Tjuta, Outback Picnic Breakfast, Pick up and return from Ayers Rock Resort. <u>The tour returns between 10:30 and 11:30hrs (your flight must depart after 13:30hrs)</u>
