Day 1: Arrival into Sydney

Sydney is one of the world's most loved cities with a lively and vibrant buzz that makes it the ultimate destination throughout the year. There are always plenty of things to do in Sydney whether it's Summer, Winter, Autumn (Fall) or Spring – from world-class dining, shows and entertainment, to sightseeing and great walks or fun in the sand at one of Sydney's idyllic beaches.

Day 2: Sydney

• <u>Private City tour</u> in a private vehicle with driver-guide (4hours) (variety of Language Guides available)

Meet your driver-guide at the hotel to start a half-day private tour. You'll discover the beautiful Sydney Harbour Bridge and you'll enjoy spectacular views of the Sydney Opera House. You will listen to the fascinating history of the city while travelling through The Rocks, Botanical Gardens, Hyde Park and Mrs. Macquarie Chair. The tour continues through the Eastern Suburbs and Watson Bay including the world-famous Bondi Beach. The tour finishes at midday at Circular Quay where you will take a lunch cruise. This Sydney Harbour lunch cruise offers restaurant-quality ambience, seafood buffet lunch, premium beverages and a spectacular view of Sydney's star attractions. After the lunch cruise you will have free time to explore the city on foot, before making your own way back to your hotel.

Optional: before returning to the hotel you can visit the Sydney Aquarium, the Sydney Wild-life zoo or the Sydney Opera House (see the description on day 4. Rates on request)

Day 3: Sydney

• <u>Full day private Tour to Blue Mountains</u> with driver-guide (variety of Language Guides available). The Blue Mountains make for the perfect holiday destination for families, nature lovers, and adventure seekers. The Blue Mountains are so named because, from Sydney, they look blue. They are clad in vast forests of eucalypts (commonly called gum trees), which in the hot sun discharge a fine mist of eucalyptus oil from their leaves. The mist refracts light, which makes the haze look blue at a distance. Your private tour today includes entry to Scenic World to ride on the Scenic Railway, Skyway and Cableway; lunch at local restaurant and a visit to Featherdale Park which features Australian native animals such as Koalas and Kangaroos.

Railway: Discover the thrill of a 52 degree incline riding the steepest passenger railway in the world, the Scenic Railway. The Railway experience descends 310 metres through a cliff-side tunnel, emerging into ancient rainforest at the Jamison Valley floor.

Skyway: Suspended 270 metres above ancient ravines, the Skyway provides a unique thrill as breathtaking views are revealed beneath your feet through the electro-glass cabin floor. For the less adventurous, seating and solid flooring is also available! With 360° views, the 720 metre journey provides the best views of Katoomba Falls, the Three Sisters, and Jamison Valley stretching to the horizon.

Cableway: The 510 metre journey gently descends into the Jamison Valley and also returns visitors to the top of the escarpment. The Cableway's fully enclosed cabin provides a unique vantage point for viewing the Three Sisters, Orphan Rock, Mt Solitary and Katoomba Falls.

What inspired him to base his revolutionary design on ships' sails? How did he solve an engineering challenge considered one of the most difficult attempted anywhere in the world? You'll find out on this very special one-hour guided tour into the intricate workings of a living, breathing Opera House. AYERS ROCK (ULURU)



Welcome to Ayers Rock (Uluru) - one of the most impressive landmarks in Australia. A huge chunk of sandstone and a 'true' monolith, it resides in Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. Uluru is located down towards the southwest corner of the Northern Territory and close to the geographic centre of Australia...Welcome to the heart of Australia.

- **Non-private arrival transfer** using the courtesy shuttle bus of the resort (English-speaking driver).
- Check in at the Hotel (2 nights with 1 full breakfast at the hotel & 1

Gain an insight into the gathering and cooking of bush foods and the medicinal values of native plants. Learn firsthand from a warrior about traditional hunting methods and tribal law. Throw a spear with the help of a traditional milay spear thrower and learn the art of throwing a returning boomerang. Inclusions: Creation Story, Art of my People, Tjapukai Aboriginal and the Torres Strait Island Dance Performances, Bush Foods and Medicines, Hunting and Weapons + Didgeridoo Presentations, Boomerang and Spear Throwing Lessons and lunch.
